
Seasonal Design

Preserve un-carved pumpkins & gourds for the entire autumn season by applying liquid floor cleaner with a damp cloth.








Home Decorating Tips & Tricks The Art of Hanging Art

The way in which art is hung greatly affects how the room feels. The rule of thumb is that the center of the piece should be 57" from the floor. When art or mirror is hung above a sofa or console table, the bottom of the frame should be anywhere between 5"-10" above, depending on the size of the art. Multiple smaller art being hung together should be between 2"-5" apart and take up at least 1/2 to 2/3 the width of the furniture that it is placed above. Art needs to be scale appropriate for the wall it's on and feel harmonious with the furniture it's being paired with.

Spruce Up Your Home's Curb Appeal

Curb appeal is how your house looks from its exterior appearance and what forms a buyer's first impression of your house.
